I. "Rock" collection

- From your travels this summer (whether it be to your basement to find that childhood rock collection, your backyard, the local swimming hole, to another state or country) pick up/take pictures of 5 "rocks" that are of interest to you. Keep in mind that they might be interesting because of the way they look (color, shape, size) or because of where they've been found. DO NOT PURCHASE ROCKS FOR THIS PROJECT!!!
- Photograph them. Again, using a scale (pen, key, pocket knife.)
- Create a document with a picture of each and a short description of each.
- Send this document using the title "Geology Collection Rocks: <Insert your name here>"
- Remember, all emails to me need to be in the formal, professional style with a formal salutation, closing and your name signed at the end.
- YOU NEED TO BRING THESE SAMPLES WITH YOU (IF THEY'RE SMALL ENOUGH) THE FIRST WEEK OF THE TERM!

2. "Sand" collection

- From your travels this summer (whether it be to your backyard, the local swimming hole, to another state or country) pick up/take pictures of I sand sample (a handful placed into a water bottle, small Tupperware etc. is plenty) that is of interest to you. Keep in mind that it might be interesting because of the way it looks (color, shape, size) or because of where it's been found.
- Photograph it. Again, using a scale (pen, key, pocket knife). This can be challenging due to its small size!
- Create a document with a picture of sand and a short description.
- Send this document using the title "Geology Collection Sand: <Insert your name here>"
- Remember, all emails to me need to be in the formal, professional style with a formal salutation, closing and your name signed at the end.
- You won't be using this sand until October so we'll be storing it in the classroom!

Teamwork: You may work with other students in the class to complete this project, but each student must turn in his or her own project with a unique set of samples. Again, please be creative in completing this project and DO NOT wait until a few days before to complete this task.
